CFC PROGRAM

There has been an agreement since 2012 between Ilula Young Women Christian Association (YWCA) and YWCA/Young Men Christian Association (YMCA) of Norway through Fredskorpset (Norwegian Peace Corp) to run Youth Program in the exchange project of Communication for Change (CFC). The agreement is renewable based on 1 year and it involves youths between 18 to 25 years. Communication for change program involves youth exchange from developing country and developed country (Norway). Developing countries involved in CFC Bangladesh, Madagascar, South Africa and Tanzania.

In the program they develop leadership skills and learn about global issues. They also learn the differences in cultures and how to cope with being a part of another culture. Not only do they exchange cultures, ideas and way of living, they also contribute to the community of residence by giving a training. This year, the program had two participants from Norway and three from Tanzania. The students gave a training every Saturday of the week to students from Ilula scout group. The kids from the scouting group really enjoyed this training and it was quite useful and educative for them. The participants from Norway were Hedda Granum Evensen and Adrian Sagvold Grondahl and they left on the 30th of November and the CFC participants from Ilula were Happy Kindole, Amos Mkungile and Jocelyne Mlenga and will leave to Norway in January.
